Early methods of military communication included flags, written messages, and horns. In the 20th century, the radio and its equipment became dominant, and the speaker allowed others to listen in over long distances.

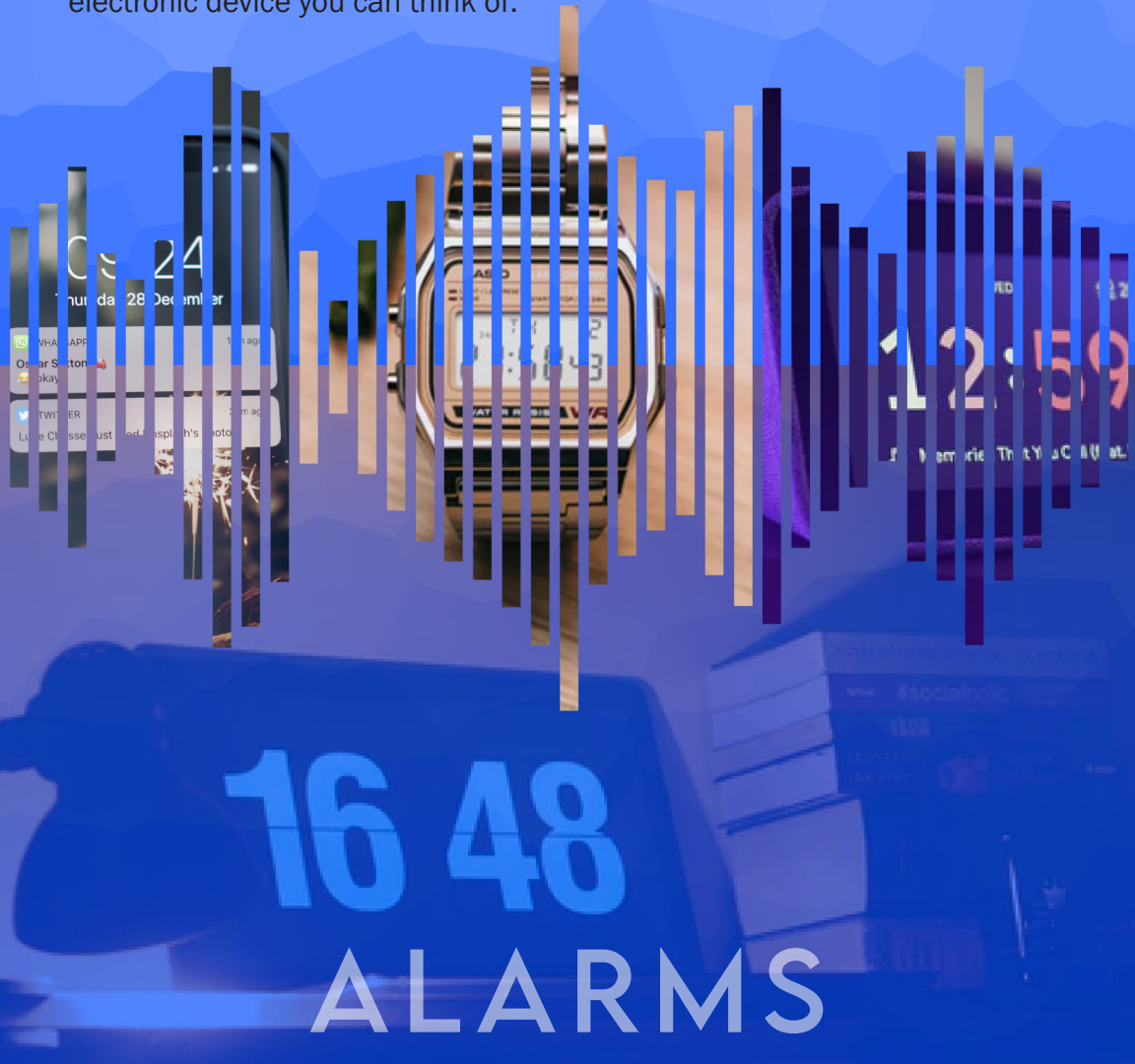
